RE: Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)

We are pleased to announce the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the FY 2021 Building Resilient Infrastructure in Communities (BRIC) Grant and FY 2021 Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA). The two grant programs will provide funds to states, local communities, tribes and territories for eligible mitigation activities to strengthen our nation's ability to build a culture of preparedness. These programs allow for funding to be used on projects that will reduce future disaster losses. This is not a guarantee of funding, but an opportunity to apply for assistance. Details of how to apply are listed below. Please keep in mind that these applications are competitive nationwide and therefore must be complete and thorough. Applications will be accepted via FEMA GO (FEMA's online grants management system) starting Thursday, September 30th, 2021 until Monday, November 29, 2021 at 5:00 PM CST. This will give AEMA staff time to review applications received after this date and time will not be considered for funding. The application deadline of January 28, 2022 reflects the deadline for the state to submit to FEMA via FEMA GO NOT the state deadline of Monday, November 29, 2021 at 5:00 PM CST. The development of FEMA GO is a multi-year effort to modernize and transform the way FEMA conducts grants management. FEMA GO will streamline the process to apply for, track and manage FEMA grants.

If you are submitting an application, it is highly recommended that you read this guidance document for eligibility and application requirements.

Applications must be submitted via FEMA GO at: <u>https://go.fema.gov/login?redirect=%2F</u>.

You must register for a username and password to gain access at: https://go.fema.gov/register.

Please see the instructions below to begin the process for establishing an account in the FEMA GO system. If at any point in this process you have questions or need support in finding your DUNS number or setting up an account, please contact your AEMA HM Division Specialist.

- 1. Notify the AEMA of your intent to apply be emailing your AEMA HM Division Specialist with your organization name and DUNS Number.
- 2. Register for a FEMA Go account at go.fema.gov/register.
 - A. You will need your organizations DUNS Number.
 - B. You may receive a notice that states your 'Organization is already registered' in this case the POC listed will need to create an account and assign you as a 'suborganization authorized representative'.
- 3. Notify AEMA when your account is set up and permissions are in place by emailing <u>your</u> AEMA HM Division Specialist.

Please include a brief description of your proposed project type</u>. If you choose to submit a grant application, the deadline to submit in FEMA GO will be **Monday**, **November 29, 2021 at 5:00 PM CST (no exceptions)**. If you have any questions, please let your Hazard Mitigation Division Specialist know as soon as possible.
